Assist. Prof. Dr. Porawan Witwanukool is the director of JBI Evidence-Based Healthcare Ramathibodi School of Nursing Center, Thailand, and a nursing lecturer in the adult and gerontological nursing division at the Ramathibodi School of Nursing, Faculty of Medicine, Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University. She is an expert in quantitative research, systematic reviews, cancer support, nursing education, and intervention design. Her expertise is demonstrated through her work in symptom management for individuals with cancer and her significant contributions to gynecological nursing.



Dr. Tirachat Sewatanon is a pulmonary and critical care physician and medical educator at Maharat Nakhonratchasima Hospital, Thailand. He earned his MD with Second Honors from the Faculty of Medicine, Siriraj Hospital, Mahidol University, and holds board certifications in Internal Medicine and Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital, Thailand. He has also received advanced training in simulation-based medical education in Switzerland and Australia. He serves as Director of the hospital's Simulation Training Center and is actively involved in postgraduate training, hospital-based sepsis quality improvement, and medical education leadership. His work includes establishing specialized respiratory clinics and leading translational simulation programs in the real situation to improve patient care.



Conjoint Assoc. Dr. Kate Kynoch is a Registered Nurse with over 20 years of experience in critical care, research, evidence synthesis, and implementation. She holds a Conjoint Associate Professor position with Mater Health and Queensland University of Technology and is also the Director of the JBI Queensland Centre for Evidence-Based Health Innovation. Kate's work centres on enhancing quality and safety in healthcare by supporting clinical staff to integrate evidence into practice and aligning research with hospital policies and procedures. She is committed to building capability and driving sustainable quality improvement initiatives that improve patient outcomes and safety. Dr. Kynoch's research program focuses on improving patient and family experiences in healthcare, addressing patient and family health information needs, and enhancing patient safety. She has authored over 30 systematic reviews published in leading journals such as JBI Evidence Synthesis, Worldviews on Evidence-Based Nursing, and Journal of Neuroscience Nursing. Her work has been cited more than 1,500 times, reflecting her significant impact in the field. Dr. Kynoch is also involved in the development and implementation of evidence-based practices in healthcare settings, aiming to bridge the gap between research and clinical practice.



Dr. Donruedee Kamkhood is a nursing instructor in the Pediatric Nursing Division at the Ramathibodi School of Nursing, Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University. Her research focuses on symptom management and nutrition in children with cancer. She also conducts systematic reviews to develop evidence-based guidelines for improving symptom management in pediatric oncology in Thailand.
